Dear Resident,

The Turnbull-McCormack Government's 2018 Budget will help to unlock the potential of Wide Bay, building new roads, including the lifesaving \$800 million Bruce Highway Cooroy to Curra Section D project, and more than \$190 million for other road upgrades; create more than 300 local jobs with \$14 million invested through the Regional Jobs and Investment program; deliver more aged care services, and fund hospitals, schools, councils, and community services.

More than 52,200 workers in Wide Bay will be up to \$530 better off per year with tax relief for low and middle income earners, while 17,574 local businesses will benefit from legislated tax cuts and the \$20,000 instant asset write-off.

Local projects, events and community organisations will help build stronger Wide Bay

communities, with \$1.6 million provided through the Building Better Regions Fund.

The Coalition Government is increasing funding to Queensland hospitals by \$29.5 billion by 2024-25, a 34 percent increase - and providing for the elderly with 14,000 additional home care packages and 13,500 new residential places.

This Budget guarantees funding of the National Disability and Insurance Scheme, helping 3,969 people and their families in Wide Bay; as well as giving a substantial boost to Government and Independent Schools, with funding rising by \$35.7 million.

The 2018 Budget ensures the Government lives within its means. with a forecast return to budget balance in 2019-20, and a projected surplus of \$11 billion in 2020-21.

Grant to build a stronger South Burnett

A \$468,000 grant will help people bounce back after being affected by natural disasters in South Burnett, with an innovative program delivered by the Burnett Inland Economic Development Organisation (BIEDO).

The project, Inclusive CommuniTIES - Stronger Together, received funding under the Strong and Resilient Communities grants program, which will be used to develop resources, deliver workshops and run project activities to help people who are suffering adverse conditions, as well as improving their social inclusion and economic welfare.

Budget boost to help the aged

The 2018-19 Budget delivers ground-breaking reforms for aged care, increasing high-level home care packages by 86 percent to 74,000 over the next five years, plus 13,500 extra residential places, and more mental health funding for older Australians.

"This delivers more choices and more support for people as they age, and allows them to enjoy living at home for longer while getting the care they deserve," Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said.

"As the high care packages are rolled out, people waiting for a level 3 or 4 home care package will receive their package much quicker, which frees up packages at the lower levels.

"We are also making it easier to use MyAged Care, and the new Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission will ensure older Australians receive the best possible care.

The 2018-19 Budget also provides \$60 million for capital investment, and aged care providers in regional Australia will receive \$40 million for urgent building and maintenance works.



Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien and Minister for Aged Care Ken Wyatt met with aged care service providers and residents to discuss the Wide Bay's needs, which include more aged care places and improved access to home care.

\$14.6 MILLION PACKAGE DELIVERS 300+ JOBS

More than 300 new local jobs are being created with a \$14.6 million investment in businesses, through the Wide Bay Burnett Regional Jobs and Investment Package.

"The Coalition Government is working in partnership with local businesses to strengthen regional areas including Wide Bay, by providing matching funds to help them expand to deliver more jobs. These projects in Maryborough, Gympie, Murgon and Rainbow Beach will drive economic growth and provide long-term sustainable employment," Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said.

GROWING JOBS FOR GYMPIE

Nolan Meats received nearly \$5 million to double the size of its meat processing facilities, creating 45 construction jobs and a further 200 permanent jobs once the \$10 million project is complete.

Suncoast Gold Macadamias at Glanmire received \$270,000 for two projects to increase factory throughput with state-of-the-art processing technology and data management systems.

Tourism operators in Rainbow Beach will generate jobs with a \$10,000 grant to provide skills and training on increasing visitor numbers and maximising opportunities in domestic and international tourism markets.



BEEFING UP MURGON BUSINESS

High-quality cattle hide producer Teys Australia will receive \$267,406 under the Regional Jobs and Investment Package program to put towards a \$567,000 expansion plan.

The plant currently produces about 20,000 hides a week, and the expansion will increase production by about 20 percent, creating up to 15 full-time jobs and securing Teys' position in domestic and overseas markets.



MARYBOROUGH SAWMILL BRANCHING OUT

A \$1.75 million federal investment at Dale and Meyers sawmill will help generate 30 jobs, with an innovative new product line of laminated timber products made from scrap materials.

This will create new jobs and improve the mill's sustainability, allowing it to expand into exciting new markets.

\$800 million to save lives on Bruce Hwy

An \$800 million commitment by the Coalition Government will save lives in Wide Bay, with funding confirmed in the 2018 Budget for the Cooroy to Curra Section D upgrade.

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien advocated passionately to have the vital stretch of highway fast-tracked, and said the funding commitment would prevent countless tragedies, as well as opening up regional Queensland for new tourism and economic growth opportunities.

"As Member for Wide Bay, and in my former career as a road crash investigator, I have seen the devastating impact of serious accidents between Cooroy and Curra," Mr O'Brien said.

"I have worked closely with families,


emergency service workers, media, local councils, road safety groups, and the Wide Bay community, taking their concerns to our Government to highlight how vital this project is.

Section D will provide a new 26-kilometre, four-lane realignment of the highway around Gympie, completing the final link in the 62-kilometre upgrade of the Bruce Highway between Cooroy and Curra.

Construction is expected to start before the end of the year and will take approximately three years to complete.

The project will be managed by the Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads.

The upgrade will eliminate eight sets of traffic lights between Maryborough and Cooroy, help flood-proof the road, ease traffic congestion in Gympie, and improve access to the Cooloola Coast, Brisbane and beyond.



Two new overtaking lanes for Bruce Highway at Tinana

Detailed designs are nearly complete for new northbound and southbound overtaking lanes on the Bruce Highway at Tinana.

The \$13.32 million project is fully funded by the Australian Government and will provide safer overtaking opportunities and improve highway traffic flow.

"These overtaking lanes will improve the safety, speed and efficiency of the highway by giving drivers the chance to overtake slow-moving vehicles safely," Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said.

\$6.3 million road upgrades in Wide Bay

Local roads across Wide Bay will be smoother and safer with more than \$6.3 million Coalition Government funding for upgrades through the Roads to Recovery program.

Fraser Coast Regional Council will receive more than \$1.6 million for road repairs in 2018-19; Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council will receive \$254,143 and \$1.45 million for the South Burnett Regional Council.

Noosa Council has been allocated \$1,410,744 for pavement rehabilitation between the intersection of Mary Street and Weyba Road towards the intersection of Noosa Drive and Leslie Drive.

Gympie Regional Council will get \$67,783 in this year's Budget, on top of almost \$4.2 million provided in recent rounds of the Roads to Recovery program, which funded major works at Gympie, Glanmire, Chatsworth and Curra.

Banking Royal Commission provides welcome change

Consumers and small businesses in Wide Bay are already benefitting from the newly-established Australian Financial Complaints Authority (AFCA) which offers free, fast and binding dispute resolution in financial matters.

The authority provides a one-stop shop to ensure consumers get a fair deal in resolving disputes with their banks, insurers, super funds and small amount credit providers.

The Coalition Government has also made access to AFCA easier by redefining a small business as any business with fewer than 100 employees. We have also increased the compensation available to small primary producers, up to \$2 million.

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien was instrumental in setting up the Royal Commission, which covers the banking, insurance, superannuation finance and wealth management industries.

"More than 5,000 people have made submissions to the Royal Commission, which will highlight and remedy previous errors made by the financial sector so that the public can once again have faith in these fundamental economic institutions and ensure they meet community expectations," Llew O'Brien said.

The Commissioner, the Honourable Kenneth Madison Hayne AC QC, will provide a final report by February 1, 2019.

Gympie's headspace set to help youths

A new *headspace* service at Gympie will open its doors in July, offering mental health support for people aged 12 to 24.

The Turnbull-McCormack Government has invested more than \$716,000 through the Central Queensland, Wide Bay, Sunshine Coast Primary Health Network (PHN) to establish the service, which will be operated by United Synergies.

The service will offer mental health, related physical health, alcohol and other drug use services, and social and vocational support.

"Mental health is a serious concern for many of the 5,000 young people living in the Gympie region, so *headspace* will be a critical first step in getting the right support at the right time," Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said.

The Coalition Government is building on record investment in mental health services, recently announcing an additional \$110 million to extend and expand mental health programs for young Australians.

Switching on improved phone services

New and upgraded mobile phone base stations will boost telecommunications at Windera, Tansey, Poona and Wide Bay Highway between Kilkivan and Woolooga.

The Windera and Tansey base stations were funded under round 2 of the Australian Government's Mobile Black Spot Program, while towers at Poona and Wide Bay Highway were funded through a priority round.

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said the new infrastructure would make a demonstrable improvement to convenience and safety for residents, as well as increasing business opportunities.

"As a former police officer, I know the difference mobile phone coverage makes during emergencies or natural disasters, and these improvements will make these communities safer by ensuring people can call for help when needed," Mr O'Brien said.

"The upgrades will also provide for at least 12 hours of back-up power at each macro base station to ensure mobile coverage is not lost during power outages."
